HIGHER EDUCATION EMERGENCY RELIEF FUND DISCLOSURE 1st Quarter 2022

Section 18004 (e) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act”), Public Law No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (March 27, 2020), directs institutions receiving funds under Section 18004 of the Act to distribute from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (“HEERF”) Section 18004(c) of the CARES Act Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus (including eligible expenses under a student’s cost of attendance such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care). Having signed and returned to the Department of Education the corresponding Recipient’s Funding Certification and Agreement, CHAC distributed no less than 50% of funds of CARES Act funds received to provide financial relief to students until funds depleted by March 2021. The school has received additional funds under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA), Public Law 116-260, signed into law on Dec. 27, 2020, authorized the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (“HEERF II”) and under the American Rescue Plan Act, 2021 (“HEERF III”) enacted on March 11, 2021, to be distributed to students.

ATTACHMENT A - Methodology

Due to the highly widespread and disruptive nature of Covid-19, CHAC considers that all students have incurred unexpected expenses in the categories of housing, food, childcare, transportation, technology, and/or health care to be able to continue their education. Until HEERF funds deplete, as long as students are enrolled in one of our programs and remain in active status, such funds will be evenly distributed on a monthly basis in the amount of \$200 per student.

ATTACHMENT B – Guidance to Students

Students have been advised to use HEERF funds received strictly to cover cost of attendance expenses incurred to be able to continue their education at school, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and childcare.
